Author of the acclaimed book [The Boy Who Was Raised as a Dog](#), Dr. Perry is the author of over 300 journal articles, book chapters and scientific proceedings and is the recipient of numerous professional awards and honours.

His experiences as a clinician and a researcher with traumatized children have led many community and governmental agencies to consult Dr. Perry following high-profile incidents involving traumatized children. These include the Branch Davidian siege, the Oklahoma City bombing, the Columbine school shootings, the September 11th terrorist attacks and the Katrina and Rita hurricanes

His clinical research and practice has focused on high-risk children - examining long-term cognitive, behavioural, emotional, social, and physiological effects of neglect and trauma in children, adolescents and adults. This work has been instrumental in describing how childhood experiences, including neglect and traumatic stress, change the biology of the brain – and, thereby, the health of the child

A focus of his clinical research over the last ten years has been on integrating concepts of developmental neuroscience and child development into clinical and therapeutic practices. (www.childtrauma.org)
